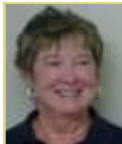

In an effort to provide training, the Master Gardener Specialist- Composter Training was created as an intensive multi-day training that will empower Master Gardeners with knowledge and skills required to effectively support and multiply Texas AgriLife Extension Service efforts in Earth-Kind® environmental educational programs. The class focuses on composting for the home gardener with insight to commercial compost production.

Compost has many positive benefits when used in our gardens and landscapes. Most people try what they think is composting but often end up with trash piles. This training is meant to help explain the correct way to home compost as well as the added benefits of its usages in the garden. It will include practical applications of composting for the home gardener with the science behind it all, which in turn benefits us all and the environment we all live in.

Master Gardeners who fulfill specified training and volunteer requirements will be recognized as Master Gardener Specialist in the specified field of Composting. This certification does not empower the individual with supervisory or administrative authority within his/her local county programs but provides them the knowledge to support their Master Gardener Educational Outreach Program

Master Gardener Specialist Training-Citriculture July 29-30, September 2-3, (Session 3 TBA)

The popularity of growing citrus in the home landscape has grown significantly in recent years. Citrus is also an important horticultural crop in Texas agriculture. The future of successful citrus production in Texas, at the home or commercial level, hinges upon preventing the establishment and spread of Citrus Greening (CG) Disease in the state. Citrus trees infected with CG produce undesirable fruit and have a shortened lifespan. The disease is vectored by psyllid insects that have been detected in Texas. CG-infected trees have been found in Mexico, and several U.S. states, including Florida, California, and Louisiana.

The Texas AgriLife Extension Service is offering a Master Gardener Specialist training in citriculture during 2010 to enlist Master Gardeners' assistance for detection and prevention of CG. The MG Specialist-Citriculture training is a comprehensive educational program aimed at preparing Master Gardeners to grow citrus in the home orchard successfully and manage the challenging complex of associated insects and diseases, including CG. The two-day course will cover varieties, nutrition, frost protection, propagation, as well as identification and management of insects and diseases of citrus.

Due to the imminent threat of Citrus Greening, the MGSpecialist-Citriculture training will be offered three (3) times in 2010. The first two sessions are as follows:

July 29-30, 2010, Fort Bend Co. Ag/Extension Center, 1402 Band Road, Rosenberg, TX, hosted by Fort Bend Co. Master Gardeners.

September 2-3, 2010; The Neighborhood Place, 3014 Rivas St., San Antonio, TX 78228 hosted by Bexar Co. Master Gardeners.

The date and location of the third session are To Be Announced.

Participants for each session must be preregistered by their County MG Coordinator/Agent and approved by the MG Specialist Training Coordinator (Monte Nesbitt, Extension Program Specialist). Due to the urgency in training Master Gardeners to detect and mitigate movement of CG, priority is being given to individuals who reside in counties from Williamson County (Georgetown) and south. If available seats are not taken by Master Gardeners in this "citrus zone", other Master Gardeners in Texas interested in the training will be invited to attend one of the three sessions. Fee for the course is being specially priced at \$85/person, because of state grant awards for CG prevention. Registration fee includes educational materials and three meals.

Jasper County MG Association

The Jasper County Master Gardener Association is somewhat of a phoenix. Wiped out after Hurricane Rita, the chapter re-organized last fall and graduated its first class in five years in March. They went from zero to 20 certified master gardeners.

"We have so much enthusiasm and demand was so great, we gave it a rest and started another class last week," explains secretary Sharon Kerr. Those 27 won't graduate until November.

Jasper County has just 37,000 residents and soon will have 47 master gardeners.

"I bet you look that up on a per capita basis and you won't find anyone doing better than that." Kerr says. You can hear the pride in her voice.

Their big project?

A Farmers Market open Saturday mornings May through November.

"It came about this way," Kerr said. "Our Agrilife leadership board was really interested in a Farmers Market. While we were getting our Master Gardening group put back together, we realized the only way we would have enough support to operate a Farmers Market was if it was a master gardening project."

So the Jasper County MG Association joined the Texas Certified Farmers Market Association.

"They give us lots of advice and we were able to buy liability insurance through them."

Then, for funding, they held a cake sale.

"I never would have dreamed you could raise \$6,000 off a cake sale but one of the commissioners had the idea of auctioning off the cakes. So we spread the word: you want a Farmers Market help us by baking a cake or coming to the auction and bidding on a cake."

Commissioner Charles Shofner was the auctioneer.

Kerr says the farmers market opened to tremendous community support.

"We typically have 6 to 10 vendors," she said. "We have people selling honey and eggs and fresh produce. We even have home school kids showing up with potatoes and berries."

You can check them out on Facebook at Jasper County Farmer's Market.

Their secondary project is an arboretum along Sandy Creek through downtown Jasper. The group plans a walking trail, native plant garden and bog garden.

"We even plan a Junior Master Gardener project for the fall," Kerr said.

Little group. Lots of enthusiasm. Big success.
